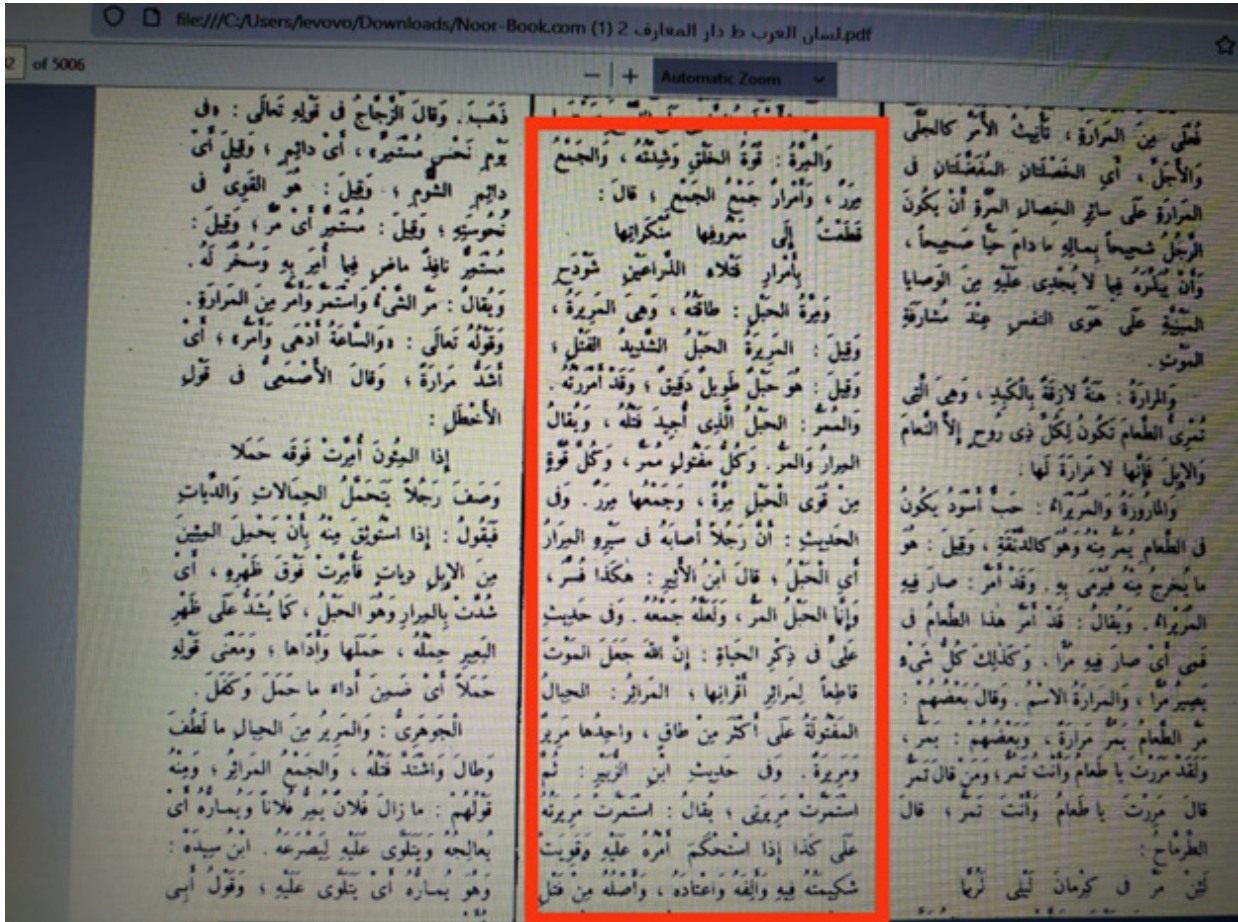


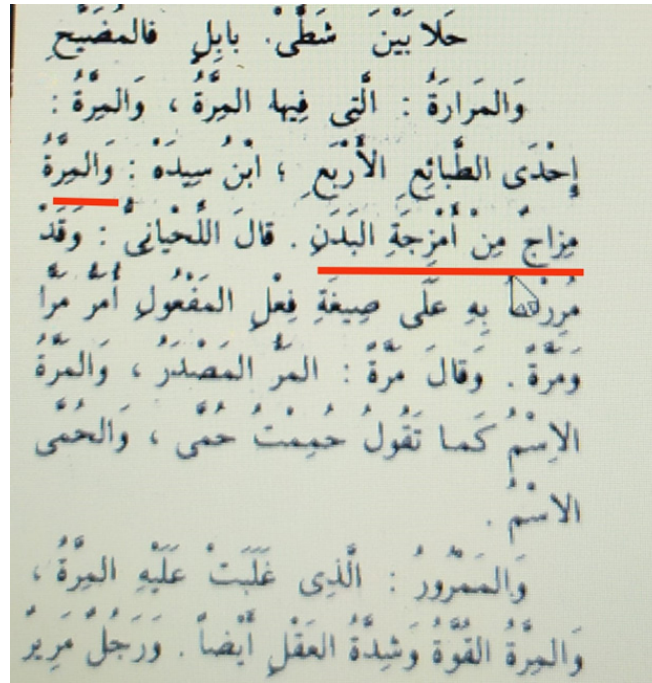

- 1) The strength and intensity of creation.
- 2) Highly coiled strand (cord).
- 3) The rope that has been coiled well.
- 4) Fine long cord.

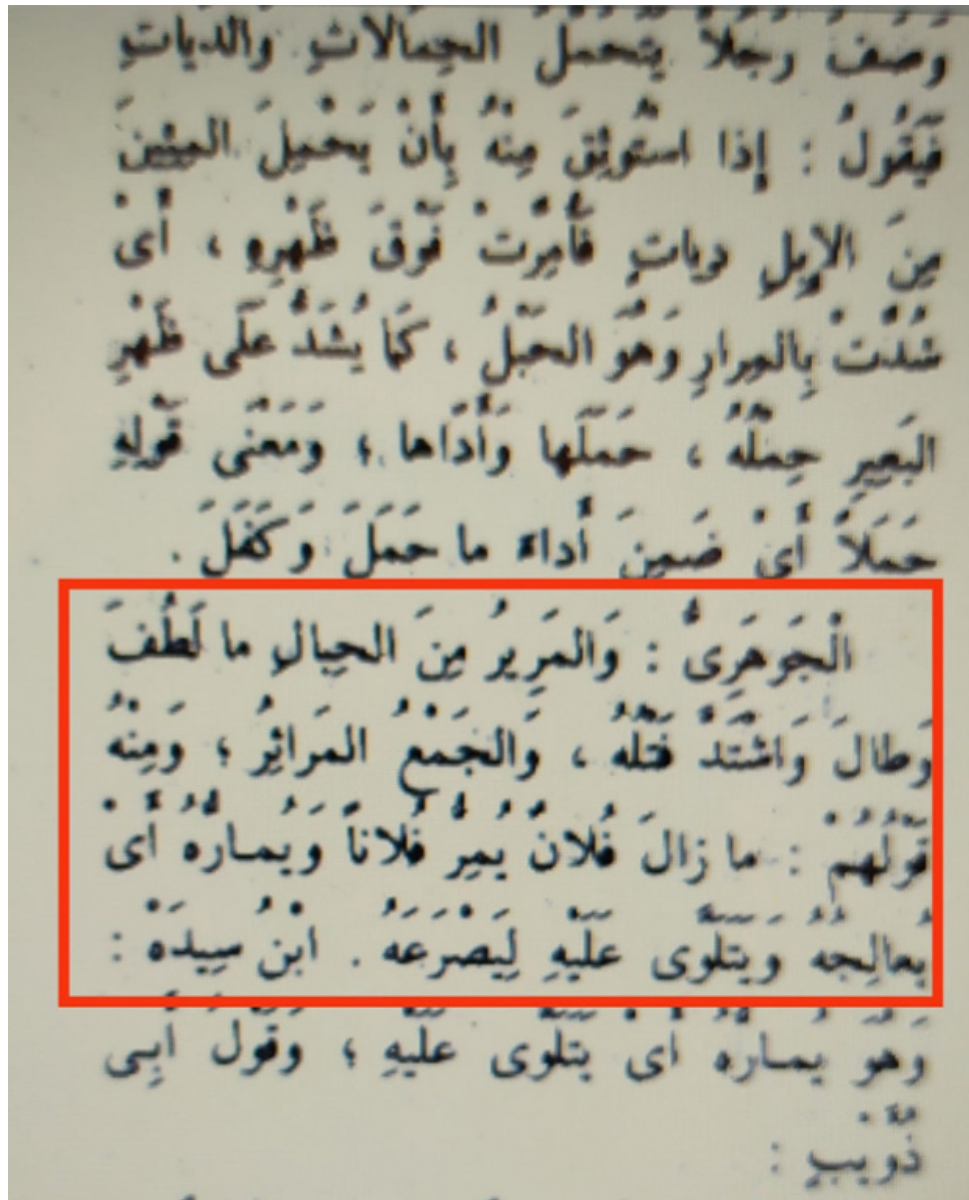


Page No 4176- dictionary of Liasn al- Arab.

- 2) The strength and intensity of the mind.

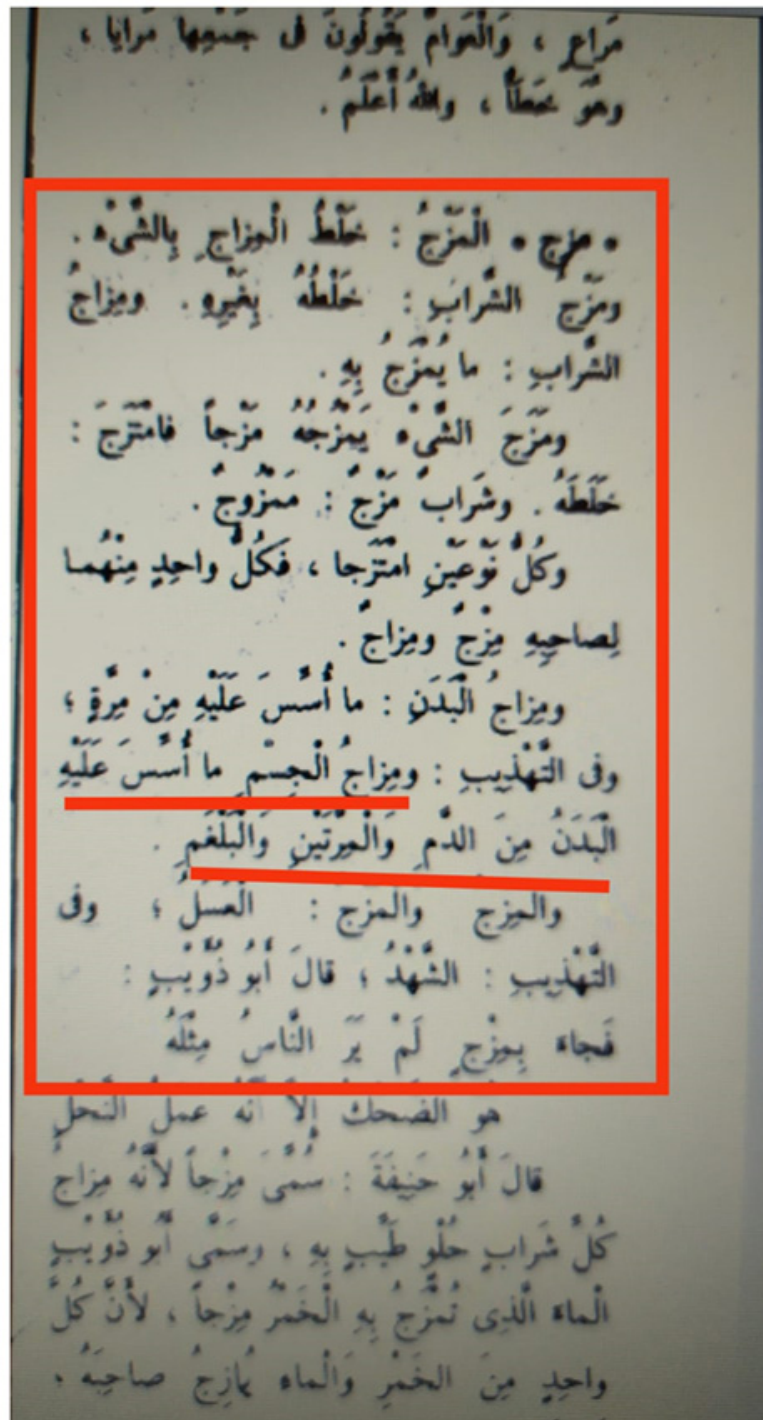




Page No 4176 - dictionary of Liasn al- Arab.

This quote explains the meaning of the word (al-merratu) as:

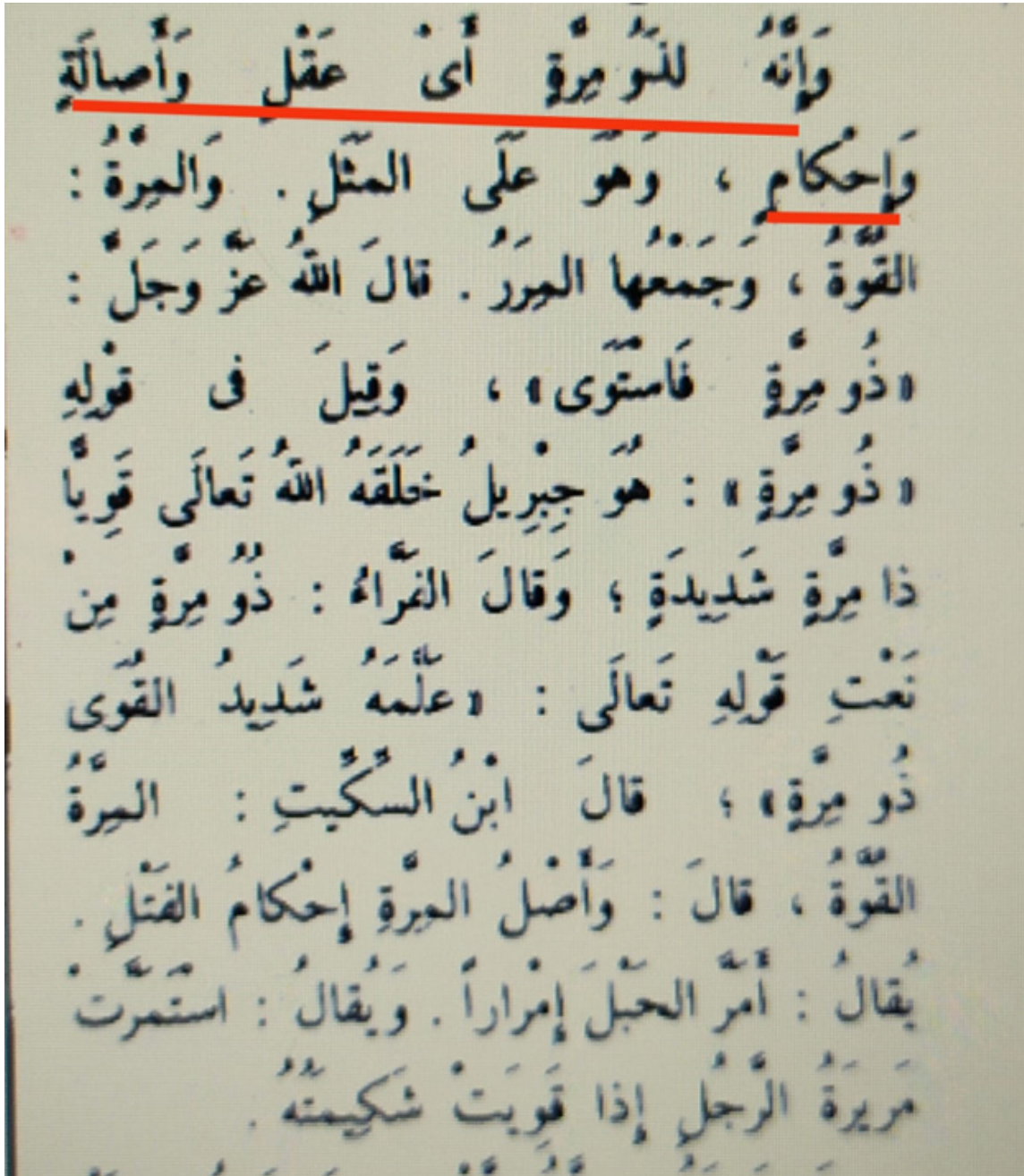
The ropes which are thin, fine, long and severely coiled.
